Ohio Consumer Outcomes System

- Rule passed in 2003
- Mandatory submission suspended September 2008
- Measuring Outcomes Efficiently (MOE) Workgroup reviewed system December 2008-May 2009
- ODMH terminated system in September 2009
- System Features:
 - Records required for all service recipients
 - Multiple clinical measures
 - Poorly aligned with SAMHSA Block Grant requirements

MOE Workgroup Guiding Principles

- Reduce Administrative Burden by 50%
- Align Outcomes Measurement with SAMHSA's Block Grant Requirements
 - National Outcome Measures (NOMs)
 - Population of Focus: SMD/SED
 - Global, program-level service outcomes
 - Randomized Sampling: Consumer Perception of Care
 - MHSIP for adults & YSS-F for families of children & adolescents



Federal Block Grant Today

- 2009-2011 Block Grant provides \$13.7 million annually to the community
 - In SFY11, 68% of BG will go to direct services
 - Prevention & early intervention programs
 - Technical assistance for EBP adoption, implementation
 - Statewide Consumer, Family & Youth advocacy organizations

Data Infrastructure Grant (DIG)

- Noncompetitive SAMHSA grant to support collection and submission of NOMs
- 2011-2013 DIG allocation: \$132,940 per year
- ODMH applied for 2011-2013 in April 2010, expects funding to begin in October 2010
 - Alignment with SAMHSA NOMs provides competitive advantage for Discretionary Grants

2011-2013 DIG Requirements

- Client-level data for 5 NOMs
 - Access to public hospital services  PCS
 - Access to community services  MACSIS
 - Living Situation
 - Employment / School Suspensions
 - Criminal Justice Involvement
-  Treatment Episode Outcomes (TEO-BH)
- Consumer Perception of Care
 - 2,000 adult surveys (MHSIP)
 - 2,000 family surveys (YSS-F) Random Sampling

Consumer Perception of Care

Survey Sampling

- 2010 Block Grant Report: ODMH subcontracted with Public-Private Solutions, Inc. (dba, Fairfield County Board) to collect a convenience sample through providers
- 2011-2013 Block Grant Reports: ODMH-ORE will randomly select and survey adult consumers and family members of children & youth enrolled in MACSIS

Treatment Episode Outcomes (TEO)

- Mental Health counterpart to the Treatment Episode Dataset (TEDs) collected through BH-Mod and reported by ODADAS to SAMHSA
 - Client-level data submission
 - New and updated records submitted annually to SAMHSA
- Discussion with ODADAS to build an MH component for TEO records submission online or batch through BH-Mod
 - Minimize reporting burden
 - Integrated reporting system

Submission of TEO Records

- TEO records only for individuals deemed SMD/SED
 - Determined by provider
 - Based on Diagnosis & GAF
- TEO records updated annually for active cases
- Business rules still under development

TEO NOMs Required by SAMHSA

- Living Situation & Employment Status
 - Parallel measures in ODADAS' BH-Mod
 - No MH definitions for Living Situation categories
- School Suspensions
 - No measure in BH-Mod
 - Was consumer suspended in 12 months prior to beginning services? Was consumer suspended since beginning services?
- Criminal Justice Involvement
 - SAMHSA-AOD NOM measures past 30 days
 - SAMHSA-MH NOM measures past year
